The 2019 University of Toronto MVS Studio Program **Graduating Exhibition** features the projects of the 2019 Master of Visual Studies graduate students Dana Prieto, Mehrnaz Rohbakhsh, Miles Rufelds and Sahar Te.

**Dana Prieto** is an Argentine artist and educator based in Toronto. Her work explores intimate and socio-political entanglements of mundane objects and rituals, manifesting through sculpture, installation, performance and writing. Prieto's interdisciplinary practice inquires and invites us to

unsettle our ways of relating, thinking, making and consuming in the Anthropocene.

**Mehrnaz Rohbakhsh** is an interdisciplinary artist based in Toronto, who focuses on visual art and sound. She has exhibited her work in Canada, the US, Italy, and Japan.

**Miles Rufelds** is an artist and writer based in Toronto. Rufelds' interdisciplinary work weaves historical research with fictional, speculative, or narrative structures. Often working backwards from contemporary political-economic anxieties, his projects probe the technocratic systems connecting industry, science, ecology, and aesthetics.

**Sahar Te** is a multidisciplinary artist whose practice mobilizes methods that open up alternative realities and confront convention. Exploring the role of past narrativization as it shapes the future, Te's interventions range from language and semiotics, social dynamics and ethics, to media studies and oral histories. Te's projects engage in socio-political and technopolitical discourses to understand hegemony within different power structures.

**The University of Toronto Shelley Peterson Student Art Exhibition** is an annual exhibition celebrating the diverse artistic excellence of visual studies undergraduate students from all three campuses. The selected works best represent contemporary art practices with a self-reflexive consideration. The nineteen emerging artists rethink conceptual and material boundaries through risk-taking and playfulness of form. The

exhibition considers themes of surveillance, cultural construction, and fantasy.

The exhibition is curated by Laetitia Dandavino-Tardif, Kesang Nanglu, and Melina Mehr as part of their Master of Museum Studies' Exhibition Project at the Faculty of Information, University of Toronto.
