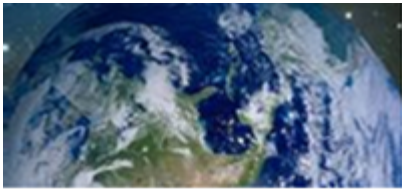

John is the curator-in-residence for U of T's own Art Co-
M.A in the Visual Studies Curatorial program. He has an
upcoming show, **Rocks, Stones and Dust**.

What makes a well-curated show? One that
inspires speculation into types of knowledge you
cannot access through traditional forms of
education. And, one that allows the artwork to shine.

What's interesting to you about rocks?

Everything! I was first introduced to Aboriginal
Curatorial ideas through rocks; to think about the
respect and life already embedded in objects. Rocks
are so present in our lives, but there is so little
attention paid to them.

Favourite place on campus? The block between
UC, Hart House and Trinity. The stone architecture
is the most beautiful in the city, perhaps even in the
country.

Why should students visit campus galleries? The
most interesting things are hidden in the galleries
and there is something new every time. In our show,
you can see an art piece about a rock being sold for
one million dollars on eBay, and the woman who fell
in love with it.

One artist in the show says: "***Given that we all come from
really just stones that walk and talk.***"
