Another history lesson is currently on display at all four of the University of Toronto's galleries and it is essential viewing (and reading) for anyone with even a modicum of curiosity about contemporary artistic practice. A massive endeavor organized by a collective of curators from every region in Canada, *Traffic: Conceptual Art on Canada 1965-1980* might not be the most visually appealing exhibition you'll see all year (which is no surprise considering it came out of a rejection of the tyranny of the eye), but is so comprehensive in its summary of artists and activities that made up the 20th Century's most radical challenge to all that came before that you can't help but immerse yourself in the documents and ephemera. Be prepare to stay for hours, working through instructional pieces, photo-documents, magazines, videos, works on paper, and more, visiting every part of the country from the North to Vancouver to Halifax to all parts in between. It's too bad there's not a dedicated website to summarize how each gallery (the Justina M. Barnicke Gallery, the U of T Art Centre, the Blackwood Gallery, and the Doris McCarthy Gallery) covers different zones, and I hope a thick catalogue is in the production to gather all this information in one handy tome. Once it shuts down in Toronto at the end of November, the whole exhibition hits the road and will make appearances across the country. Mark it on your calendar now.
